

Dr. Monteic A. Sizer

President and CEO

Dr. Monteic A. Sizer is the President and Chief Executive Officer of the Louisiana Family Recovery Corps. Under his direction, the Recovery Corps has transitioned into a one-of-a-kind non-profit organization. Under Dr. Sizer's leadership, the Recovery Corps has become a more business-oriented organization and has streamlined its operations, making the agency more accountable to its government and philanthropic funders and the people of Louisiana, while also demanding reciprocal accountabilities from those with whom it works.

Dr. Sizer was appointed President and CEO of the Recovery Corps on January 1, 2009, after serving as the agency's Chief of Staff. He has led the organization's transition from one that simply provided gap services to one that now, in addition to providing direct services to people, focuses on aligning state and federal resources, building the capacity of the non-profit sector, conducting research and developing policy, and advocating and educating on the issues of human recovery.



Locally, Dr. Sizer is a member of the Education Council of the Baton Rouge Area Chamber and the Education Issue Council of the Louisiana Association of Business and Industry. Nationally, Dr. Sizer is a member of the Human Services Recovery Subcommittee of the National Commission on Children and Disaster. He is also a Leadership Fellow with the Effective Leadership Program at the Center of Leadership and Public Values at Duke University and the College of Business at Southern University (Baton Rouge) and a member of the 2010 class of Leadership Louisiana.

Prior to joining the Recovery Corps, Dr. Sizer consulted for and led the child and adolescent specialized crisis counseling program for Louisiana Spirit, a FEMA-funded program within the Louisiana Office of Mental Health. He also consulted with the Assistant Secretary of the Louisiana Department of Social Services' Office of Family Support to help think through non-profit organizational capacity-building and Latino access and service provision. Dr. Sizer also assisted with juvenile justice reform efforts at the local and state levels.

Before those roles, Dr. Sizer worked at the Z. Smith Reynolds Foundation, a statewide agency in North Carolina with nearly half a billion dollars in assets. While at the Foundation, Dr. Sizer assessed non-profit organizations and made funding recommendations in the areas of social justice and equity, community development, education, the environment, and governance and public policy. Further, he regularly consulted with agency heads and other high-level government leaders, corporate CEOs, education officials, and non-profit executives regarding policy development and reform activities. Specifically, Dr. Sizer led the Foundation's education system realignment strategies and statewide teacher professional development initiative.



The founder of Strategy International, a public policy, coalition-building, and strategy-development consulting firm, Dr. Sizer has led a major non-profit organization, co-authored published articles, conducted research, functioned as a consultant to executives, and worked as a clinical-community psychologist serving poor and underserved populations. Dr. Sizer's knowledge of non-profit management and community development is extensive. He was a program participant in the Executive Management Institute at Vanderbilt University and the Leadership in Non-Profit Management at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte. He monitors state and federal legislation that relates to public policy and community development, and has expertise in working with federal, state and local governments, implementing programs, and building external relationships.

Dr. Sizer is a political fellow and former board member of the North Carolina Institute of Political Leadership (IOPL), North Carolina's premier statewide political candidate development organization. Some of Dr. Sizer's honors include receiving the United States Achievement Academy and All-American Scholar Awards. He is a member of Phi Delta Sigma Scholastic Honor Society and was named to Who's Who in America.

Throughout his career, Dr. Sizer has been extremely active within numerous professional organizations, government committees and boards, including the Institute for Grantmakers, Charlotte Rotary Club, North Carolina Network of Grantmaking's Race, Poverty, and Public Policy Working Group, Charlotte Mecklenburg Human Service Council, Charlotte Mecklenburg Community Relations Committee, Charlotte Chamber of Commerce Partners for School Reform, Winston Salem Chamber of Commerce Education Council, Barber-Scotia College Board of Trustees, and the Charlotte Mecklenburg Juvenile Crisis Prevention Council, among others.

Dr. Sizer earned an Associate in Applied Science Degree in Industrial Safety, Security, and Health Management Technology from Central Piedmont Community College before receiving his Bachelors of Science (Summa Cum Laude) in Psychology and Criminal Justice from Pfeiffer College. He earned a Ph.D. in Clinical-Community Psychology from the University of South Carolina at Columbia.
